
# Where is the Power?

# Where Is the Power? If the Church is Truth – Why is There no Power?

# Introduction

The modern church proclaims it has the Truth. Bibles in hand, crosses on the wall, tongues in the mouth, and hands lifted high—yet when we look for the power Scripture speaks of, we find emptiness. Where are the healings that defy science? Where are the miracles that silence skeptics? Where is the boldness that once shook kingdoms and parted seas? We see lights, but no fire. Sounds, but no voice. Emotion, but no presence. If the church is truth, why is there no power? These are not accusations—they are questions born from years of witnessing a form of godliness that denies the very force it claims to carry. The time has come to pull back the curtain. To ask the hard things. And to search the Scriptures for the ancient power that has been lost... and must be found again.

The modern church is full of music, movement, and motivational messages. But one thing it lacks—undeniably, undeniably—is power. Not charisma. Not noise. Power. The kind that heals the sick, raises the dead, opens blind eyes, silences storms, and sets captives free.

Yet they claim to have the Truth.

So, I ask again: Where is the power?

When Jesus said, "*Greater works than these shall you do*," did he lie? Or did modern Christianity inherit a gospel devoid of Covenant, divorced from obedience, and—because of that—cut off from the power of YHWH?

#### The Uncomfortable Question

Truly, truly, I say to you, the one who believes in Me, the works that I do—he will do also; and greater than these he will do... (John 14:12)

Yeshua's words were not vague. He made a bold promise: those who believe would do greater works than He Himself did. Not equal. Not similar. Greater.

The early assemblies, according to the Book of Acts, walked in this. Blind eyes opened. The lame leapt. Prison doors broke open without human hands. The dead rose. The sick was healed by the mere shadow of a passing man. There was power.

And yet... we look around today and see none of it.

Where are these "greater works" now?

Where are the healings that silence doctors?

Where are the prophets who speak with fire and see it fall from the sky?

Where is the Spirit that convicts the room, splits the heavens, or drops a liar dead at the altar?

Instead, we see stages bathed in soft lights and fog machines. We hear swelling music that stirs emotions but leaves spirits empty. We see televangelists wave their coats and "slay" the crowd—but somehow, cancer remains, and funerals go on as planned. The hospitals are still full. The graves still receive.

And all the while, the church insists, "We have the Holy Spirit."

But if that's true—then why do we not see the same works He promised? Why does the power feel... absent?

This isn't about mocking. It's not about slandering or condemning. It's about asking what should have been asked long ago:

If this is the "truth" they preach... why then does it produce no fruit? If the Spirit truly dwells among them... where is the fire?

For years, this question stirred deep in me. I waited at altars. I watched the crowd. I fasted, prayed, sang, and listened. But the heavens remained silent. I heard passion—but not power. I saw movement—but not miracles. I left wondering if something was missing—or if everything was.

That question followed me like a shadow:

Where is the Power?

And the longer I walked the narrow path of truth, the more clearly, I began to see the answer.

But first... we must confront the experience.

# Personal Witness: What I Experienced in the Church

I remember the lights.

The music bellowing.

The room shifting as hands lifted in rhythm to the chords.

The preacher's voice trembling—eyes closed, arms raised.

The invitation came like a whisper: "Come to the altar... the Spirit is here."

I believed it. Every time.

They said He would come. They said I would feel Him.

They said if I just opened my heart, or sang louder, or wept harder—He would meet me there.

So, I went.

And I waited.

And I watched.

People around me fell. Some shouted. Others swayed and wept.

But inside me? Silence.

No wind. No fire. No weight. No change.

Just me... and the growing question I didn't dare ask out loud:

Was that it?

It wasn't until one night I prayed an felt like I was filled with the Holy Spirt At least it was what I believed, because I was taught, I must speak in tongues Did I? I believed I did

They called it the "move of the Spirit."

They said revival had come.

But now as I look back at it seemed to have felt more like hype than holiness.

More like emotion than encounter.

Over time I noticed a pattern.

The same people came forward every week—needing the same deliverance,

the same filling, the same breakthrough.

They'd weep at the altar... and walk out unchanged.

We had music, but little manifestation.

We had sermons, but no signs.

We had noise—but no power.

It wasn't just the absence of miracles that haunted me.

It was the performance of the whole thing.

The priming. The pacing. The manipulation.

It was the way the keyboard would swell at just the right moment... preacher raised his voice...

The way I was told to expect power—but never saw any.

I began to wonder if we were all just chasing a feeling.

If we had learned how to produce a replica of presence—without actually walking in it.

Were there moments that seemed real? Yes.

Tears that felt sincere? Yes.

But as time went on, even those began to feel... suspicious.

Manufactured.

Because what is real must bear fruit.

And there was none.

I had been taught to expect fire—but all I found was fog.

I had been promised power—but I received performance.

The truth is... I didn't need louder music. I didn't need to be told to shout or shake.

What I needed was YHWH—and what I got was a simulation.

That realization broke me.

And it planted the seed of hunger that would eventually lead me back to the only place power ever truly flowed:

Obedience. Covenant. Torah.

III. Where the Power Broke: The Gospel Without Torah

Truth and power are linked to obedience.

Christianity teaches belief alone—but the power came after obedience in Scripture.

Have they inherited a broken cistern?

They have hewn for themselves cisterns that hold no water. (Jer. 2:13)

How Torah isn't just law—it's the blueprint of Divine Presence.

The Real Source of Power: Covenant and Obedience

There is a pattern in Scripture that never changes—YHWH confirms His own Word, not man's inventions.

You can sing, dance, wave banners, cry out for fire... but if there is no obedience to His covenant, then there is no power. Period.

True power—the kind that parts seas and shakes kingdoms—follows obedience. It always has.

Mosheh did not stretch out his hand over the sea on a whim.

He obeyed the voice of YHWH—and the waters fled.

Eliyahu didn't call down fire through emotional buildup.

He rebuilt the altar of YHWH, restored covenant order, and then—and only then—did the fire fall.

Yehu was anointed by command. He followed precise instructions. And the wicked house of Ahab fell like a tree cut at the root.

Every great act of divine power in Scripture is preceded by alignment with Torah.

YHWH does not pour out His presence on rebellion.

He does not validate false worship with real signs.

He is not obligated to bless what He did not command.

#### **Deuteronomy 28** — The Covenant of Power

And it shall come to pass, if you diligently obey the voice of YHWH your Elohiym, to guard to do all His commands... all these blessings shall come upon you... (Deuteronomy 28:1–2)

This article lays it out plainly. Obedience opens the gate for blessing, protection, and presence. Disobedience? It brings curse, confusion, and weakness.

The modern church cries out for revival but rejects the very Torah that brings YHWH near.

They quote the blessings but ignore the conditions.

They want the fruit without planting the root.

#### Numbers 14 — The Cost of Disobedience

After the people rebelled and refused to enter the land, YHWH pronounced judgment.

They mourned. They changed their mind. And then they tried to go up anyway.

#### But Mosheh said,

Why now do you transgress the command of YHWH? It will not succeed. (Numbers 14:41)

And he was right. They went up without His covering—and they were struck down.

They had the numbers.

They had the courage.

They even had the promise...

But without obedience? They had no power.

YHWH had withdrawn. And without Him, they were no match even for the least of their enemies.

We must stop assuming that passion equals power, or that emotion equals anointing.

True power comes only from walking in step with the Covenant of the Most High.

The Spirit of YHWH does not dwell in rebellion.

The miracles of Scripture were not rewards for feelings—but responses to faithfulness.

The church keeps crying for fire...

But YHWH is still waiting for the altar to be rebuilt.

## **Counterfeit Movements & Theatrics**

The people shake and dance about.

The worship swells in crescendo.

People lift their hands, shout in tongues, collapse in waves across the altar like a choreographed dance.

It feels like power.

But when the dust settles—nothing changes.

The sick are still sick.

The oppressed are still oppressed.

The people who fell on the floor get back up... and return to their sin.

No chains broken. No demons cast out. No wisdom imparted. No hearts pierced.

They call it revival.

But it bears no resemblance to what Scripture calls holy.

These are theatrics—sacred-sounding performances designed to stir emotion, but completely void of the Spirit of YHWH.

It is a gospel of goosebumps, not truth.

A gospel of impressions, not transformation.

A gospel that feeds the soul but starves the spirit.

They have seduced My people, saying 'Peace!' when there is no peace—building a weak wall and covering it with whitewash.

(Yechezqel / Ezekiel 13:10)

This is exactly what we're witnessing today.

False prophets and self-appointed apostles whitewashing their platforms with lights, music, and clever stagecraft—while the wall beneath is cracked and crumbling. They preach comfort to a people under judgment. They promise breakthrough without repentance. They offer blessing without obedience.

And the people love it so.

But YHWH does not.

Many will say to Me in that day, 'Master, Master, have we not prophesied in Your Name, and cast out demons in Your Name, and done many mighty works in Your Name?' And I will declare to them, 'I never knew you. Depart from Me, you workers of lawlessness. (Mattithyahu / Matthew 7:22–23)

They used His name.

They did signs and wonders.

They looked anointed.

But they were lawless.

The Greek word behind "lawlessness" is anomia—without Torah. Not without passion. Not without ministry. Without Torah.

They prophesied—but He never knew them.

They performed miracles—but He calls them strangers.

Because real relationship is built on Covenant.

Without it, even signs and wonders are counterfeit.

The deception of a powerless gospel is worse than no gospel at all.

It creates a sense of spiritual safety... while the soul continues in rebellion.

It trades transformation for theatrics.

It promises fire—but delivers fog.

YHWH is not moved by volume.

He is not impressed by emotionalism.

He does not respond to staged "anointing."

He is drawn to obedience.

He confirms His Word—not man's performance.

And until the altar is rebuilt, until the Torah is restored, until the lies are cast down...

there will be no power.

# The Counterfeit Power Brokers

They wave jackets like magic wands.

They scream into microphones.

They slap foreheads and shout "Healing!" as entire crowds collapse like dominoes.

Faith healers. Televangelists. Anointed charlatans.

Today's spiritual celebrities—more showman than shepherd.

They sell the illusion of power... while picking the pockets of the desperate.

And the people do.

Because they're hungry.

Hurting.

Deceived.

But where are the actual healings?

<sup>&</sup>quot;Sow your seed and your miracle will come!"

<sup>&</sup>quot;Send your tithe and your healing is on the way!"

<sup>&</sup>quot;Touch the screen, speak the name, and walk in your breakthrough!"

Why no doctor's report?

Why no proof of cancer vanishing, bones mending, or eyes opening?

Why do the wheelchair-bound rise only while the cameras are rolling—then return to their seats behind the curtain?

Why do the blind never see... until the lights are off and the offering plate is full?

These are not servants of YHWH.

They are actors.

Performers on religious stages—dramatizing the divine for profit.

And their act is not new.

They prophesy lies in My name. I did not send them... they are prophesying to you a lying vision, worthless divination, the deceit of their own minds. (Yirmeyahu / Jeremiah 14:14)

They traffic in lies and call it anointing.

They merchandise the Spirit and call it ministry.

They prey on the sick, the lonely, the desperate—and call it sowing seed.

They have turned healing into a business, and the Spirit into a spectacle.

They say they carry power. But what they really carry is fog machines, staged testimonies, paid actors, and rehearsed encounters.

Not fire.

Not holiness.

Not YHWH.

Because YHWH is not a showman.

His power is not for sale.

His Spirit does not entertain.

Where is the fire from Mount Sinai that made Israel tremble?

Where is the Ruach that struck Ananias and Sapphira dead for lying—never mind faking a healing?

This generation has traded awe for applause.

Holiness for hype.

Obedience for emotionalism.

Torah for theatrics.

These false teachers—slick, polished, rich beyond reason—are no different from the ones Yeshua warned about:

Many will say to Me in that day, 'Master, Master, have we not prophesied in Your Name? And cast out demons in Your Name? And done many mighty works in Your Name?' And I shall declare to them, 'I never knew you. Depart from Me, you who work lawlessness! (Mattithyahu / Matthew 7:22–23)

They used His Name—but rejected His Covenant.

They performed signs—but walked without Torah.

They fooled the multitudes—but never fooled the Most-High.

Because YHWH knows the difference between a vessel and a stage prop.

True power cannot be faked.

It is born of obedience.

It is carried by humility.

It is confirmed by YHWH—not cameras.

And it cannot be manufactured, marketed, or mimicked by men who walk without the Covenant.

Those who know YHWH don't have to pretend.

His power follows them—not because they shout loud enough...

But because they walk in the Ancient Path, and He walks with them.

## The Evidence of Real Power

What does real power look like?

Not emotionalism.

Not glittering stages.

Not theatrics disguised as anointing.

But this:

Justice that rolls like rivers.

Holiness that cannot be faked.

Wisdom that cuts through lies like lightning through mist.

Acts of power that align perfectly with YHWH's character, not man's applause.

Real power is never self-serving.

It does not shout into microphones or sell deliverance by the hour.

It flows quietly, cleanly, with the authority of Heaven.

And it always, always leads people back to Torah — not further from it.

The Blueprint of Power — Yeshayahu (Isaiah) 11

When the Ruach (Spirit) of YHWH rests on someone,

Scripture does not say they speak in tongues or convulse wildly.

#### Instead:

The Spirit of YHWH shall rest upon him — the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of YHWH. (Yeshayahu / Isaiah 11:2)

This is the evidence of real anointing.

Not confusion.

Not noise.

But clarity, conviction, and awe before the Most-High.

#### They Fell on Their Faces

In Scripture, when the presence of YHWH was revealed — no one fell backward.

They fell on their faces.

Moses (Moshe), Joshua (Yehoshua), Ezekiel (Yeḥezqel), Daniel (Dani'el) Every prophet who stood in the presence of the Holy fell prostrate, trembling with reverence — not showmanship.

Contrast that with today's modern "revivals," where the Spirit supposedly knocks people down in waves...

And yet no repentance follows.

No holiness.

No return to Torah.

Real power causes the soul to bow.

It doesn't entertain.

It awakens.

# The Evidence of Real Power (expanded)

# Biblical Manifestations of Power — Aligned with YHWH's Character

# Moses (Moshe) at Sinai – The Mountain Trembled, The People Did Too

YHWH descended in fire. The mountain shook. Thunder, lightning, and shofar blasts filled the air. The people stood afar off, terrified — not slain in the spirit, but shaken to their core.

**Real Power:** Holiness that draws fear and reverence.

Outcome: A Covenant sealed in awe.

And it came to pass on the third day in the morning, that there were thunders and lightnings, and a thick cloud upon the mount, and the voice of the trumpet exceeding loud; so that all the people that was in the camp trembled. And Moses brought forth the people out of the camp to meet with God; and they stood at the nether part of the mount. And mount Sinai was altogether on a smoke, because the LORD descended upon it in fire: and the smoke thereof ascended as the smoke of a furnace, and the whole mount quaked greatly. And when the voice of the trumpet sounded long, and waxed louder and louder, Moses spake, and God answered him by a voice. And the LORD came down upon mount Sinai, on the top of the mount: and the LORD called Moses up to the top of the mount; and Moses went up. (Exodus 19:16–20)

# Elijah (Eliyahu) at Mount Carmel – No Tricks, Just Fire from Heaven

The prophets of Ba'al danced, shouted, cut themselves — Nothing happened.

But when Eliyahu called upon YHWH,

Fire fell and consumed everything — altar, stones, water, dust.

**Real Power:** No showmanship. No games. Just obedience and confidence.

Outcome: The people cried, "YHWH — He is Elohim!"

And it came to pass at the time of the offering of the evening sacrifice, that Elijah the prophet came near, and said, LORD God of Abraham, Isaac, and of Israel, let it be known this day that thou

art God in Israel, and that I am thy servant, and that I have done all these things at thy word. Hear me, O LORD, hear me, that this people may know that thou art the LORD God, and that thou hast turned their heart back again. Then the fire of the LORD fell, and consumed the burnt sacrifice, and the wood, and the stones, and the dust, and licked up the water that was in the trench. And when all the people saw it, they fell on their faces: and they said, The LORD, he is the God; the LORD, he is the God.

(1 Kings 18:36–39)

# Moshe's Shining Face - Glory Too Great to Behold

After speaking with YHWH, Moshe's face shone so brightly he had to cover it.

No screaming. No theatrics. Just quiet radiance.

Real Power: Glory that doesn't need to advertise itself.

**Outcome:** The people feared to draw near.

And it came to pass, when Moses came down from mount Sinai with the two tables of testimony in Moses' hand, when he came down from the mount, that Moses wist not that the skin of his face shone while he talked with him. And when Aaron and all the children of Israel saw Moses, behold, the skin of his face shone; and they were afraid to come nigh him. (Exodus 34:29–30)

#### (Ezekiel) (Yehezgel) and Daniel (Dani'el) - Falling on Their Faces

When the presence of YHWH or His messengers appeared, the prophets didn't fall backwards... They collapsed face-down.

Overwhelmed. Silenced. Stunned.

Real Power: Reveals the smallness of man, the holiness of YHWH.

Outcome: Prophetic commissioning, trembling obedience.

As the appearance of the bow that is in the cloud in the day of rain, so was the appearance of the brightness round about. This was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the LORD. And when I saw it, I fell upon my face, and I heard a voice of one that spake.

(Ezekiel 1:28)

So he came near where I stood: and when he came, I was afraid, and fell upon my face: but he said unto me, Understand, O son of man: for at the time of the end shall be the vision. Now as he was speaking with me, I was in a deep sleep on my face toward the ground: but he touched me, and set me upright. (Daniel 8:17–18)

Therefore I was left alone, and saw this great vision, and there remained no strength in me: for my comeliness was turned in me into corruption, and I retained no strength. Yet heard I the voice of his words: and when I heard the voice of his words, then was I in a deep sleep on my face, and my face toward the ground.

(Daniel 10:8-9)

# Elisha and the Healing of Na'aman - No Drama, Just Obedience

Elisha didn't lay hands, shout, or wave a mantle.

He didn't even come outside.

He told Na'aman, "Go wash in the Yarden seven times."

**Real Power:** Quiet instructions from a man who feared YHWH.

Outcome: Leprosy gone. Pride gone. A Gentile humbled before the Elohim of Israel.

So Naaman came with his horses and with his chariot, and stood at the door of the house of Elisha. And Elisha sent a messenger unto him, saying, Go and wash in Jordan seven times, and thy flesh shall come again to thee, and thou shalt be clean. But Naaman was wroth, and went away, and said, Behold, I thought, He will surely come out to me, and stand, and call on the name of the LORD his God, and strike his hand over the place, and recover the leper. Are not Abana and Pharpar, rivers of Damascus, better than all the waters of Israel? may I not wash in them, and be clean? So he turned and went away in a rage. And his servants came near, and spake unto him, and said, My father, if the prophet had bid thee do some great thing, wouldest thou not have done it? how much rather then, when he saith to thee, Wash, and be clean? Then went he down, and dipped himself seven times in Jordan, according to the saying of the man of God: and his flesh came again like unto the flesh of a little child, and he was clean.

(2 Kings 5:9–14)

## In Closing of this Section

These were not random acts of might.

They were revelations — divine unveilings — given to men who walked in humility and reverence.

Through Moshe, YHWH revealed His covenant.

Through Eliyahu, He revealed His exclusivity.

Through Yehezgel and Dani'el, He revealed His majesty.

Through Elisha, He revealed that healing flows through obedience, not showmanship.

This is unconventional power.

It doesn't look like empire.

It doesn't feel like religion.

And it never bows to entertainment.

Torah is not legalism. It is not religion.

It is *the* framework — the sacred vessel — through which YHWH's power flows.

A structure that guards holiness.

A rhythm that protects revelation.

A way of life that prepares the soil for divine presence.

If you're not standing within that framework... you're outside the current of power.

## What True Power Looks Like

Not hype.

Not glitter.

Not emotional ecstasy.

True power is quiet — and uncompromising.

It doesn't need to perform.

It simply is.

It shows up in a man who won't cheat, in a woman who won't gossip, in a child who honors father and mother when no one's watching.

It's in the one who walks away from what is popular, because it violates what is holy.

#### **Power That Looks Like Obedience**

When Torah is written on the heart, power flows not around us, but through us.

# Why So Many Don't See Power Anymore

Because they've abandoned the Source.

Be set-apart, for I am set-apart. (Vayiqra / Leviticus 11:44)

The operating system of the Kingdom.

Without it, everything else is counterfeit.

"My people are destroyed..."

My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge. Because you have rejected knowledge, I also reject you from being priest for Me; since you have forgotten the Torah of your Elohim, I also forget your children. (Hoshea / Hosea 4:6)

This is not about academic knowledge.

This is about the neglected and forgotten Torah.

YHWH doesn't abandon His people arbitrarily. He removes His presence when they remove His ways.

So, if we want His power again... we must return to His instructions.

We must return to the Ancient Path (Jeremiah 6:16).

Truth is not found in emotion or performance, but in alignment with YHWH's Covenant.

Torah is not a religion; it is not legalism – it is the framework of power.

# Conclusion — The Choice Before You

This is the line in the sand.

You must choose:

- Hype or holiness.
- Tradition or truth.
- Emotion or obedience.

The power has not disappeared.

# **Questions to Ponder**

If the modern church has the "Holy Spirit," why is there so little evidence of real power?

#### **Answer:**

Because true power follows obedience — not performance. The Ruach of YHWH does not dwell in disobedience. Without Torah, there is no alignment with the Source.

What does Scripture say happens when people encounter the true presence of YHWH?

#### **Answer:**

They fall on their faces, not backward. They are filled with awe, fear, and silence, not chaos or theatrics. (See Moshe, Yehezqel, Dani'el, Yeshayahu.)

What is the difference between counterfeit power and real power?

#### **Answer:**

Counterfeit power draws attention to man — loud, flashy, unconfirmed. Real power glorifies YHWH — quiet, holy, transformative, rooted in obedience.

Why did the power depart from the modern church?

#### **Answer:**

Because they replaced Covenant with entertainment, and traded Torah for tradition. They also rejected the Covenant and Torah of YHWH, as a result YHWH withdrew His power and Spirit.

# What must we do to walk in the true power of YHWH again?

#### **Answer:**

Return to the Ancient Path.

Return to Torah.

Walk in obedience, truth, and surrender — and the power will return, not as noise, but as fire.

As Blood is to the Body – So Torah is to the Soul
